We have been serving the poor in Romania for so long and have seen so much poverty and heartache that very few things shock us as they did in the beginning.



It seems as though such is the case with spiritual matters as well. When we get caught up in frivolous or mechanical orthodoxy, our eyes drift away from the Lord and His Word, and our love tends to diminish and grow cold. Oh, how we need to hear what the Spirit spoke to the Ephesian Church noted in Revelation 2: "Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent and do the first works." That very same Spirit beckons us today to return to our first love!



After traveling for two weeks throughout Romania and Ukraine with Christopher, a gifted photographer, and brother in the Lord, my passion for this work was reignited, and my love for the Lord set ablaze!




repent and do the first works, or else I will come to you quickly and remove your lampstand from its place-unless you repent."

Urgent

Ecclesiastes teaches us that "To everything there is a season, a time for every purpose under heaven." While builders everywhere prefer a mild season to build, circumstances out of our control make specific projects unpostponable.

The following two projects are of such nature; we would like to see them completed before the freezing temperature settles in.

The Marian and Ramona Ciulei family from Madirjac have tried everything to stabilize their crumbling home. Due to the inclination of the land they inherited and the lack of a proper foundation and drainage around the house, their home, the size of a shack, was no longer safe to live in.



Marian shared how he and Ramona went abroad to work, leaving their three children in the care of a relative, hoping they could muster up enough money to purchase the materials needed to build a concrete landing in front of the home, in hopes it would be enough. They ended up not making as much money as they were promised for their seasonal work, and what they did earn, they ended up using for childcare.



During our September visit, we decided this project couldn't be put off further. The plan is to demolish the shack and start pouring the concrete for the foundation needed for the two-room home we would like to build for this family of five.

The total cost of the projects was \$25,000, but since individuals in Romania have donated various needed materials and money towards the project, the required amount is now \$10,000.

We pray that we can see this project to completion and move the Ciuleis into their home soon.



The following need came to us just before our publication deadline, and we decided to include this emergent situation in the current edition.

On October 20th, the Daniel and Mariana Vieru family were awoken at 1:00 AM to a raging fire from the annex where their wood-burning heater was.



They are incredibly grateful for God's protection as the situation could have been much worse if it had spread to just one room over where they were storing wood for the coming winter.

Daniel is a hardworking young man who has never asked for help, always working two shifts to provide for his family of seven.

This significant expense caught them entirely off guard and was much higher than they could afford.



The lumber needed for this project has been donated; the remaining money required to complete this project, which would cover a new heater, large gas tank, installation kits, and insulation, is budgeted at around \$4,800.

The falling leaves have put us on notice, once again, that winter is coming. Low temperatures have a certain appeal as our minds wander to cozy fireplaces, fuzzy socks, and some extra reading time.

Unfortunately, for the elderly in Romania, winter is a dreaded thought. While some are concerned simply by the strain on an already stretched budget, others wonder how they can survive another winter without heating their home.

The Firewood Initiative for Romania's Elderly is a project you have undoubtedly seen come up numerous times throughout the years. If the Lord tarries and winter will once again make its appearance, you will probably see it again.

Some projects can be postponed or scheduled for a later date, but this one cannot.

I was shocked to hear of the plight of over 100 widows in the Darabani area, 50 of whom could not heat their homes at all last winter.

Providentially, a donor contacted us privately inquiring about the F.I.R.E. project, and an initial batch of wood was ordered for this community. The massive order of wood will be delivered to the local church, where it will be split by the youth group, divided into equal piles, and delivered to the widows.

We praise God for this timely answer to prayer and look forward to seeing His handiwork as we desire to bless as many as He would provide for with the gift of warmth.

These traits only deepened over time; he remains very structured and responsible. For example, if medical treatment is needed. he is careful always to take his pills and not miss a dose. He is very involved in activities around his home, and his smile is contagious. We cannot believe he is already in the third grade!





He enjoys making buildings and other objects from Lego bricks, doing puzzles, and loves memorizing poems, just like his older sister Denisa. He also plays the flute in our orchestra.

Dear Brethren,

The world is changing. Not only that, but the speed with which it is changing is increasing and escalating. By any objective metric, things aren't looking good no matter where you look, nor do they telegraph that they'll be getting better.

Other than praying, there isn't much we can do to affect change or course correct. The situation isn't like a sled, where if you lean heavily to one side, you can make it go in a different direction. It's more like a train on a track, barreling toward an inevitable destination many have not prepared for.

Given what we know of what the Bible says and the warnings that have been delivered over the past few decades, the best we can hope for is that it slows down. As far as altering course or stopping it altogether, it's obvious the world has reached terminal velocity, and we've gone past the point of no return. Eventually, every nation will be compelled to pick a side, everyone drawn into the irresistible vortex that is the end times.

We know what these last days will be like; the Word has told us as much. We know there will be times of upheaval and war, rumors of war, and various natural disasters that will blanket the earth. Pestilences will make a comeback, far worse than the preview we got a couple of years back, and peace will be snatched from the earth altogether. God's intent in revealing these things to His children was not to scare or terrify us but to prepare us for what was coming and give us the time necessary to draw closer to Him.
