Andrei and Elisabeta Pascar live in Petrovka, Odesa, Ukraine, with their three children. They were temporarily allowed to live in a home without any heat and with multiple roof leaks.



Elisabeta's stepfather, who is crippled and confined to a wheelchair, struggled with depression for years. One day, as he was once again thinking of all the things he couldn't do, he started compiling a list of things that he could do. He came up with seven things that he could still do and started doing them! He could still speak, so he began preaching the Gospel! He started sharing the Good News with anyone that would listen.

Having dealt with depression while focusing on his infirmity, he started to reach out to other disabled people within the community, trying to fill a void in the life of those often neglected. Little did he know that one of the gentlemen he would be mentoring, Andrei, a young man with muscular dystrophy, would soon be his son-in-law.

Elisabeta witnessed her mother's example of lovingly caring for her paralytic stepfather, and the decades of selfsacrifices had prepared her to help in this way. She recalls that as a child, while watching her mother serve, she



would say to herself, "I want to do that someday. I want to take care of someone who cannot tend to themselves."

After a short courtship, Elisabeta wholeheartedly agreed to marry Andrei with the full knowledge that she signed up for life as a caregiver to her husband.





A few years have passed, and Elisabeta is even more committed and in love with her husband. "Of course, I would do it all over again. I love him", she proclaims as she shows our team the patient lift she uses to get her husband in and out of bed - a life-changing blessing that was given to them by visiting missionaries.

The Lord has opened their eyes to the truth, and they can hardly wait to be baptized together and raise their children in the fear of the Lord.

Our prayer is to help build a home for the Pascars that would provide shelter and warmth for them and their children and add some accessibility features that will help Elisabeta care for her husband. We estimate this project to be around \$25,000. Thank you for your prayers for this need.

When our team asked how long he had been in a wheelchair, Andrei responded, "I have been this way since age 15 but praise God I have a wheelchair. Thank you, brothers!"

Just as Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God even after intense flogging, praise that led to an opportunity to share the Gospel with their jailer, we pray that the praise that resounds from Andrei's crippled, prison of a body would be used for many opportunities to speak to others of our Lord Jesus.

Regardless of our pain, affliction, heartache, or struggles, may we be found praising our Savior! May our witness be such that many would inquire, "What must I do to be saved?"








Please pray:

An Uphill Trek

Ion Lupu and his wife, Violeta, are no strangers to hardship. The Lupus have struggled to get by for most of their lives, but with God's help, hard work, and determination, they have never gone without food for their children. They live in the remote village of Cristesti, Botosani, along with their six children. Dumitru, their oldest child, is ill and can only help with small chores around the house while supervised.



Ion is a hard worker, and he excels whenever the opportunity to earn some money for his family comes around. At times he has had to leave the country for work but acknowledges how difficult it is to leave his wife to take care of the children on her own.



The Lupus live in an old home that has seen numerous decades, and Ion has been diligent in taking care of their only shelter from the elements, patching things up the best they could.

Their most urgent need is replacing the asbestos roof that is as old as the home and has large cracks and holes, water inundating the house even with the lightest rain. They had rags pressed into the gaps in their roof as if somehow they would stop the water from coming in. Brother Ion is able to do the work but could not afford the materials on their minimal, survival-only income. The materials for their roof are around \$2,200.

Given the age of the home, we don't believe it can withstand the elements for many more winters.

After meeting with them and speaking with their pastor, and seeing their consistent work ethic, we would like to build a good home that will serve as a safe dwelling for this family for decades to come.

Mihai entered our family in the fall of 2017 along with his siblings, Cristian and Maria. The children used to live with their parents; however, after their divorce, the court granted their mother sole custody, and they were separated from their father, who went abroad in search of work.



Soon afterward, financial difficulties changed the course of their lives. An orphan herself, adopted at the age of two, the mother lost both her adoptive parents, housing, income and job. Desperate and alone, she took her children and moved to a local housing center for single mothers in need. However, this proved to be a temporary solution. Fearing they would end up on the street, the mother asked the local authorities to find a place for her children while leaving the country to find work.

Her desire is to be able to return and offer her children a home. However, until then, having no other relatives that could take the children into their care, we were asked to step in and welcome Cristian, Maria, and Mihai into our family. We immediately noticed that, in the light of so many changes, the children missed school numerous times, and they required special care and attention – not only pertaining to their education but also emotional support and personal time dedicated to helping them adjust to their home.

Mihai (or Mihaita as we like to call him) stole everyone's heart the moment he stepped into our center. He is incredibly charming and knows how to get his way. Our biggest challenge now is attempting to quiet him down long enough to complete his homework assignments. He can talk for hours without taking a breath.

Would you please keep Mihai in your prayers? We have been given the responsibility to nurture him from such a young age!



During these very years of early childhood, we have an opportunity to form a child and help him prepare for independent life, teaching him the principles and rules that will guide him forever. May every good thing that he learns here stay with him for the rest of his life, and may God help us teach him His ways and follow in His steps.

Dear Brethren,

Isaiah 5:20, "Woe to those who call evil good, and good evil; Who put darkness for light, and light for darkness; Who put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter!"
